

UTC Ice Learning Pods

UTC Ice is excited to announce that we will be providing day camps with assisted learning following San Diego school curriculum! These day camps will act as learning pod for children to come study and do their schoolwork while being in a safe and fun social setting. UTC Ice will provide a space to focus on their academics while acting as a place to stay active throughout the day!

Our monthly interactive program will allow options for families who need extra support and care throughout the day. We will be offering services that will help keep our students on track, but parents are expected to stay heavily involved with responsibilities on their schoolwork. We will be giving your students a binder so that they have immediate access to place all their necessary schedules, school documents, and other syllabus related items in an organized manner.

UTC Ice's Learning Pods operations will enforce the following safety procedures that include and are not limited to:

Daily temperature checks. These checks are mandatory for all campers and staff before check-in. Any individual with a temperature exceeding 100°F will not be allowed to enter the ice arena that day. Do not enter the facility if you feel ill, have a fever or cough, or are short of breath. If you have a medical history that places you in a high-risk category for COVID-19, we highly recommend that you do not enter.

Limited Capacity. To follow day camp guidelines, skaters will be divided into groups of 10-12 per office supervisor, according to age, for the entire day. Groups will be assigned to the same supervisors all week.

Masks. All individuals within the building are required to wear a mask at all times. On the ice, as skating can be a strenuous activity, skaters may pull their masks down to breathe while allowing for a social distance of six feet from others.

Lunches. Skaters must bring their own food for the day, including snacks and a non-perishable lunch. Campers must also provide their own water bottles.

Cleaning procedures. All staff members will sanitize supplies/facilities throughout the day.

Handwashing and hand sanitizing will be practiced frequently. Please review hygiene practices and the importance of wearing a mask with your skater prior to coming to camp.

Social Distancing. All activities on and off the ice will follow social distancing guidelines. All camp groups will be spaced out throughout the ice arena and locker rooms during each activity. Skaters are expected to be spread out where they put their belongings. We kindly ask that you discuss the rules of social distancing with your skater prior to entering the camp.

Staff training. All staff members within the facility are trained with all new COVID-19 safety measures and practices.

As you may already be aware, COVID-19 is a highly communicable virus. Protecting our guests and employees is our number one priority. With that priority in mind, UTC ICE Sports Center is taking numerous steps to reduce the potential for COVID-19 spread in this facility.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

UTC Ice is a family-focused facility and we are here to provide this much-needed support across San Diego school districts. The main goal of our learning pods is to have a place for our families to stay connected with their academics and to promote healthy, active lifestyles. We understand that you may have many questions about what to expect, and we have been working with our local school districts to help provide you with accurate answers. During these unprecedented times, we are constantly adapting to the changes that the CDC requires of our facility. With that being said, may need to adjust our programs to fit those regulations along the way.

To help give you an understanding of our program, we will be providing a live virtual parent orientation closer to the start date in order to go cover our safety precautions, go over the schedule, and tour the facility. Below are some common questions:

1. What items will be provided and what curriculum will they be following?

First and foremost, internet will be provided to our participants. We know that students will have their devices – laptop, iPad, etc. – provided by the school. Along with their learning device, headphones are also required to bring every day so that they are able to use them during their assisted learning hours. We will be providing a blank binder for all schoolwork to help them stay organized.

2. What will the schedule be like if my student has an online Google Meeting or Zoom meeting?

We are working alongside schools and schedules to see when students will most likely have their check in times, bell schedules, etc. The schedule we have put together will revolve around these online meetings so that students are able to be in the proper setting at the correct times with their tutors and learning assistants.

3. What will the groups look like?

Our first priority is safety and we will be looking to CDC requirements for our county for guidance. Our goal is to make sure that each group will be around the same grade level with consistent tutors/learning assistants throughout the week. We will do our absolute best to accommodate grade levels.

4. Who will be assisting our students?

We are working with a diverse staff who have experience in childcare and tutoring to help with our students' distance learning programs. Our staff members are certified in SafeSport and have conducted background checks to further ensure everyone's safety.

5. What is the enrollment process?

We highly urge you to enroll immediately. Since our program is very unique, we expect to hit our capacity very fast and will be giving our UTC Ice families first priority.

6. What will the tuition be – especially if schools reopen?

Our tuition is based on a monthly rate in order to make sure that groups stay consistent. We know that there are different needs for each student as far as learning paces go. We will be interactive and hands-on regularly in order to ensure the success of your student. Tuition will be due at the start of the month and will be flexible upon the reopening of schools. We will support you and your family on the return to regular school programming if/when it happens!
